20Fathoms is a nonprofit organization, and our mission is to accelerate the growth of tech startups, entrepreneurs, and scalable businesses in Northwest Michigan.



HOW DOES A COMMUNITY HELP LOCAL STARTUPS SUCCEED?

That's the question we've continuously asked ourselves since 20Fathoms was founded in 2018. Since then, that answer has changed... and will continue to change. One thing remains constant, though: our approach is rooted in data and the needs of our community.

WHY WE DO THIS WORK

Locally owned startups strengthen the communities we serve through job creation, industry diversification, and economic resilience. They also create an energizing undercurrent of innovation, powering a robust year-round economy and enabling a high quality of life.

Technology-driven startups in particular have a multiplier effect. According to the Center on Rural Innovation, "For each tech job created, three to five additional jobs are created in the local economy." These jobs can also increase opportunities and pay in other non-tech industries that create thriving communities like local restaurants, culture, and entertainment.

HOW WE EXECUTE ON OUR MISSION HAS EVOLVED OVER TIME

20Fathoms' first step in 2018 was to establish a coworking space, a place where local innovators could gather, work, connect, and build together. Since then, we've steadily grown to meet the needs of entrepreneurs in our region.

A couple of years ago, we performed in depth research into the post-Covid needs of our region's entrepreneurs. With this data and a strategic plan in hand, we set to work raising funds. **Grants and the generosity of our donors has allowed us execute on that plan, significantly expanding the depth and breadth of services throughout the region in the past year.**

OUR PROGRESS IN 2025

We're focusing on strengthening four pillars of the local startup support system: funding, knowledge and confidence, coworking, and connections. Woven throughout each pillar is specialized programming that supports the unique needs of those who have traditionally received less startup funding and resources, including women and Indigenous entrepreneurs.

This report highlights the impact of each pillar and what you – our donors and community – have made possible for local entrepreneurs in just the first six months of 2025.

As our donors and community members, we want you to know how we're stewarding the resources entrusted to us and accelerating the growth of local tech startups, entrepreneurs, and scalable businesses right now.

Annual reports are common, but we're publishing a mid-year report this year because both our team and the founders we serve have been incredibly productive and we have so much to share with you. We just couldn't wait until the end of the year!

OUR IMPACT:

200+ entrepreneurs received training, coaching, and access to funding through 20Fathoms year-to-date.

Nearly **50%** are women, Indigenous, veterans, or others who are traditionally underfunded founders.

PILLAR 1: KNOWLEDGE + CONFIDENCE

STARTUPS NEED:

A trusted resource for education and expertise

Founders have told us that it can feel overwhelming and lonely to try to figure out how to start a business all by themselves. While there is a lot of quality information and resources out there – online and via other organizations – this self-service model can lead to false starts, wrong turns, and the loss of valuable time and money.

Also, the old adage is true: you don't know what you don't know.

What entrepreneurs want is someone they can trust – someone they can turn to who can help them analyze their options, make introductions, spark ideas, and share expertise that helps them cut through the clutter so that they can accelerate the launch and growth of their businesses.

PILLAR 1: KNOWLEDGE + CONFIDENCE

2025 HIGHLIGHTS SO FAR...



375 hours of 1:1 coaching

No two businesses are alike; that's why 1:1 coaching is so valuable. We provide coaching in five communities throughout the region, allowing entrepreneurs like the founders of Memory Bright (pictured here) to receive trusted guidance and discuss challenges, opportunities, and resources.

67 startup bootcamp attendees

So far this year, 20Fathoms has hosted startup bootcamps in Benzonia, Elk Rapids, Manistee (pictured here), and Traverse City. These popular programs provide a supportive environment during which entrepreneurs learn how to bring their business ideas to life.





Indigenous Business & Marketing Essentials

This specialized bootcamp hosted in partnership with New Mexico Community Capital is designed to meet the needs of Indigenous entrepreneurs. In high demand with a waiting list for future cohorts, it incorporates cultural and traditional elements alongside business education.

60 companies served by Breakfast Lab

A unique program developed by 20Fathoms, Breakfast Lab happens weekly and provides expert guidance on business topics like customer discovery, marketing, financial modeling, and more.



PILLAR 2: FUNDING

STARTUPS NEED:

Funding to support business launch and growth

\$226,375 in startup capital distributed

IMPACT IN ACTION:

We heard it loud and clear: local entrepreneurs need access to more local capital.

Funding is a critical need for all startups, and this is particularly true in rural areas where founders historically have had significantly fewer local funding options. The hard-working entrepreneurs in our region often have the plans and the market-demand to launch and scale, but they need capital to make it happen.

20Fathoms is working to close that gap. In the past six months alone, we have distributed \$226,375 in startup capital locally. In total, we've distributed \$356,375 since launching our access to capital program in 2024.



Recipients are selected based on their strategic needs for funds, expected impact on the local economy, and/or quality of pitches. Funds are distributed to startups throughout Northwest Michigan with a particular focus on supporting those founded by individuals who are traditionally underfunded in entrepreneurship including women and Indigenous founders.

Support for this funding initiative is provided in large part by the Michigan Economic Development Corporation.

PILLAR 2: FUNDING

2025 HIGHLIGHTS SO FAR...



\$103,000 for professional services

Granted to 30 businesses so far this year, these funds allow founders who are working with 20Fathoms to contract with qualified professionals to support their product development, technology, and business startup needs. \$100,000 in small business grants

Distributed in partnership with Venture North, these small business grants are designed to support the purchase of assets that will have a meaningful impact on business growth. The Piping Plover (pictured here), located in downtown Manistee, was one recipient.





\$8,000 in TCNewTech awards

A popular pitch competition hosted by 20Fathoms, TCNewTech participants receive startup support services and compete for cash awards. Winners of the April event were Farmish, Fenx Custom, and Nic-Nix (pictured here, left to right).

Women in Tech monthly meet ups

New this spring, we hosted a Women in Tech panel discussion with inspiring speakers including entrepreneurs.

20Fathoms served as a key event partner again this year, hosting five events including an access to capital panel, a founders fireside chat, and the closing event at The Little Fleet. In its fourth year, this annual event creates opportunities for new connections, learning, and celebrating wins big and small.


Feast & Fathoms community lunches

On the first Friday of each month, our coworking members gather for Feast & Fathoms. During this community lunch and semi-structured program, we get to know one another better, build new connections, and share updates and opportunities.

The place to be on Thursdays

Visit on any Thursday and you'll find entrepreneurs gathered for Breakfast Lab, 1:1 coaching throughout the space, coworking members hard at work, and often a networking happy hour. It is a vibrant opportunity for working, learning, and connection. Bonus: we offer free coworking for Breakfast Lab attendees to ensure our workspace remains accessible to those who need it most.





A workspace where innovation thrives

We're actively investing in upgrades to make our coworking space more welcoming, modern, and conducive to entrepreneurship and innovation. Our goal is to ensure that rural geography is never a barrier to success – that our members have access to a space that meets the standards of an innovation hub. Improvements include upgraded conferencing and technology infrastructure, as well as collaboration tools and spaces.

STARTUP WINS

Oftentimes, it's hard to see the successes of an emerging startup community; the grit and growth both largely happen behind the scenes. In Northwest Michigan, the startup community is strong and growing. Here are just some of the milestones achieved by the local companies we've worked with so far in 2025.

The Aspen House opened their doors in Suttons Bay, creating an innovative and flexible solution to meet the childcare needs of local working parents.

Atterx, a biotech startup developing solutions to prevent and treat antibiotic-resistance infections, secured funding from Michigan Rise and gained approval for FDA clinical trials.

Bailey's Farms received a grant from the Michigan Department of Agriculture and Rural Development to fund a bottling line to increase production of their kombucha.

BaleCraft, a company that designs and constructs buildings using a sustainable straw-based solution, began manufacturing.

Blooma launched their first product, providing tech-based gardening resources and community. The company was also accepted into the Conquer Accelerator.

Memory Bright launched the beta version of their software to support memory retention from age-related decline, dementia, and Alzheimer's.

LifeKnight, a company that empowers safety through Al-driven solutions, was selected to pitch at SXSW.

Red Truck Orchards launched their new cherry vinegar product at a 20Fathoms event highlighting local entrepreneurs.

Rock Bottom Candles is now selling in Meijer stores. Their Great Lakes-inspired candles are created with foraged rocks, sand, and other natural elements.

The Tendon Lab opened in Traverse City, proving innovative, technology-focused treatment for the Achilles and patellar tendons.

Wave Lumina was selected to receive federal Small Business Innovation Research (SBIR) funding for their field-ready device that enables the rapid on-site measurement of PFAS.

The following local startups are recent pitch competition award winners: 8Bit Insights, Earthly After, Farmish, Fenx Custom, Immaculate Home, and Valor Skincare.



STARTUP SPOTLIGHT: ATTERX

An interview with, Jim Millar, CEO of Atterx, a healthtech startup in Traverse City.

20Fathoms: What problem does Atterx solve?

Jim: The World Health Organization has said the #1 public health issue is antibiotic resistance. Pathogenic bacteria and infections are more and more resistant to antibiotic use, and now there are "superbugs," which very few antibiotics are effective against.

We are developing clinical innovations to prevent or treat some of the most virulent infections. We have two products in development: one prevents catheter-associated UTIs and the other is a topical treatment for "gram negative" bacteria that can be used with burn infections or wound infections.

20Fathoms: Tell us about a recent milestone for Atterx.

Jim: Our product that prevents catheter-associated UTIs is gearing up to hopefully enroll patients in our first clinical trial by the beginning of the third quarter this year.

Catheter-associated UTIs have become a big problem; people are getting sick and then getting infections in the hospital while they are being treated. We use bacterial interference to prevent this from happening in the first place in catheterized patients, solving a big, costly problem in hospitals that can cost up to \$37,000 per patient to treat.

The big milestone for 2024 was getting our clinical IND (Investigational New Drug) application approved. This allows us to begin the site selection and patient enrollment process for the Phase 1b clinical trial.

20Fathoms: What piece of advice would you offer people who are looking to launch or move a business here?

Jim: My advice is to get plugged in because there's so many resources that can help you that are quite sophisticated. There are quite experienced people that are helping some of the newer startups and people looking to get things going. 20Fathoms has been an unbelievable resource and has been invaluable to me. There's so much mentorship and support. You don't have to look too far to find it.


